We are currently seeking intern leads for the following projects:

1. Coloring the Corridor - Environmental science curriculum creation for a coloring workbook for middle school students. The purpose of the workbook is to educate students about what wildlife corridors are and how they benefit wildlife and humans. We are working with local artist Kelly Quinn to create engaging coloring pages that tell the story of various plants and animals within the Florida Wildlife Corridor. Potential tasks for this project include:
 - a. researching existing open source curriculum relevant to the animals and plants already selected for the workbook
 - b. translating data/science for 6 - 8th graders and helping
 - c. selecting interesting/compelling facts to share about each plant/animal/habitat
 - d. meeting virtually with team members
 - e. researching with a Florida Wildlife Corridor staff member for potential funding opportunities to facilitate low-income access of the workbook
2. GIS Mapping - Develop conventional maps and story maps to communicate critical conservation messages relating to habitat threats, conservation

priorities and successes using a variety of data sets and programs. Ability to use ArcGIS is a prerequisite for this role. Ex. Corridor priority areas, scrub jay habitat, Florida black bear fatality locations etc.

3. Archived Footage Sorting - We have an extensive amount of B-roll from past films that needs sorting through the lens of an environmental studies background. There are many potential clips and shots within our cache that may help illustrate the ecological value of wildlife corridors and may help tell compelling stories of the flora and fauna within the Florida Wildlife Corridor. Editing is a desired but not required skill.
